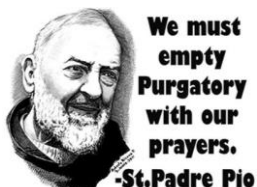

Sunday's Readings on p 167 of the Parish Mass Book...

Jesus is often referred to in the Gospels as "the Son of David".

Today's first reading gives one of the reasons why. David is appointed to rule Israel and lead his people—his flock—as a shepherd. He is chosen by God and all the tribes of Israel acclaim him and pledge themselves to him. Jesus comes as a descendant of David, whose mission was to develop that kingdom, rule and shepherding so that all peoples of all times and places can be included. So how paradoxical it is to see our King nailed to a cross, dying a criminal's death, at the mercy of others. But it is on

the cross that Jesus's mission comes to a climax. Here, death and sin are defeated by the perfect sacrifice of the Word made flesh, Jesus. But Jesus was not crucified alone: the two thieves hang each side of him. One reacts with scorn and derision in the face of his suffering, demanding that Jesus use His power (if He really has any) to get them out of this dreadful situation. But the other thief reacts differently. He sees that Jesus is God, and if God is prepared to come to earth and hang in suffering beside us, then he can do nothing except ask for God's forgiveness. And Jesus, as King, does just that and promises him a place in His kingdom. May we have such faith, and gain such reward too.

MARKING THE 50th ANNIVERSARY of the CHURCH BUILDING in 2018 A two-week Parish Mission has now been booked for **Lent 2018**, to be led by the Sion Community. Other events: Mass with the Archbishop in the summer, pilgrimage to Rome - autumn, parish meal, trip to Chelsea & the Tower in the footsteps of St Thomas More, Flower Festival and Tudor themed social event. Clearly, nothing happens without planning, we shall need a parish **Jubilee Action Group** to co-ordinate. Volunteers will be called for in due course... Meanwhile, the first artist's impression of the glass screen between font and porch can be seen in the porch. If this happens, St Thomas More will move from the porch, perhaps to where Our Lady is now and Our Lady move to the opposite side of the sanctuary where, with shortened pews, there will be much more space to pray at her shrine. What about the MRR kitchen? The heating? The exterior down pipes? The lighting? The floor? The side chapel? The curtain wall round Knoll Drive and Watercall Avenue? We can't do it all, so what shall we do? **We have much to be thankful for: marking of this anniversary should be joyous and lasting.**
