The Sunday Readings The recurring theme in this week's readings is trees. God, in the reading from Ezekiel, speaks of His

power and might through the idea of causing new trees to grow from old, the diseased to be healed and the luscious to become dried up. Jesus's parable is a much more famous passage. God's kingdom can be compared to a growing seed: how it grows, how fast it grows and what it grows into we cannot control, or understand, but grow it does. Jesus underlines the silent power of God here. His kingdom cannot be thwarted. Yes, the sinfulness of those both inside and outside the Church can be a real obstacle to its growth. Persecution can do much to harm it, as can the sins of its members. But, regardless, with the slow but sure growth that Jesus compares to a seed, grow and survive it does. How can it be otherwise, for as Jesus taught us to pray, "Thy kingdom come..."?

Congratulations on the birth of your child! Baptism is arranged by appointment. It usually happens at 12.15 p.m. on a Sunday or at either Sunday Mass. Parents should collect a form after Sunday Mass. For the baptism of children over four and of adults see the parish priest.

MAKING YOUR CONFESSION

Our God is a God of mercy! Confession, the sacrament of reconciliation, is available on Saturday mornings 9.40 a.m.-10.20 a.m., on Sundays before 6 p.m. Mass and by arrangement with the parish priest.

ADORING THE LORD: **EXPOSITION**

There are regular opportunities each week to pray before the Blessed Sacrament exposed on the altar. Saturdays from 9.30 a.m. (following Mass) and Mondays 7.00 p.m.
