

The Sunday Readings

EREMIAH never asked to be a prophet and he had a great many anxieties about speaking out to those

who were unwilling to listen. Yet, God had made him for that very purpose, from the beginning of his life in his mother's womb. As God revealed to him in the events described in today's first reading, Jeremiah's part in God's plan will not be thwarted by either Jeremiah's uncertainties or the opposition of other people. Jesus began His ministry on a tide of popularity, but few people like to have their ideas challenged or hear that they need to change. So when Jesus does both those things, those who half know Him in his home town pour scorn on the idea that he could possibly have anything important to say. Yet—like those whose heard Jesus's message 2,000 years ago from His own lips—we need to be constantly challenged to give up our selfishness, resentments, jealousies, indulgent rudeness or

whatever, or we shall hinder God's will and ignore the truth spoken by those He has sent to speak to us. And the greatest of those people is of course His only Son.

POPE ST JOHN PAUL II ON HUMAN LIFE We must care for the other as a person for whom God has made us responsible. As disciples of Jesus, we are called to become neighbours to everyone, and to show special favour to those who are poorest, most alone and most in need. In helping the hungry, the thirsty, the foreigner, the naked, the sick, the imprisoned-as well as the child in the womb and the old person who is suffering or near death, we have the opportunity to serve Jesus. He himself said: 'As you did it to one of the least of these my brethren, you did it to me' Hence we cannot but feel called to account and judged by the ever relevant words of Saint John Chrysostom: 'Do you wish to honour the body of Christ? Do not neglect it when you find it naked. Do not do it homage here in the church with silk fabrics only to neglect it outside where it

suffers cold and nakedness."

Where life is involved, the service of charity must be profoundly consistent. It cannot tolerate bias and discrimination, for human life is sacred and inviolable at every stage and in every situation; it is an indivisible good. We need then to show care for all life and for the life of everyone. Indeed, at an even deeper level, we need to go to the very roots of life and love.

(CHRISTENING) for BABIES & YOUNG CHILDREN

Congratulations on the birth of your child! Baptism is arranged by appointment. It usually happens at 12.15 p.m. on a Sunday **or** at either Sunday Mass. Parents should collect a form **after Sunday Mass**. For the baptism of children over four and of adults see the parish priest.

MAKING YOUR CONFESSION

Our God is a God of mercy! Confession, the sacrament of reconciliation, is available on Saturday mornings 9.40 a.m.-10.20 a.m., on Sundays before 6 p.m. Mass and by arrangement with the parish priest.

ADORING THE LORD: EXPOSITION

There are regular opportunities each week to pray before the Blessed Sacrament exposed on the altar. Saturdays from 9.30 a.m. (following Mass) and Mondays 7.00 p.m.
