The Sunday Readings

ODAY is a day of contrasts as we mark the start of Christ's Passion. We begin with the crowds hailing Jesus as He rides into Jerusalem. But His coming to

Jerusalem can end in only one thing: His death. His mission is to be accomplished by betrayal, rejection, pain and death. All this He submits to, meekly, without complaint for our sakes. Those rejoicing crowds shouting 'Hosanna!' become the hate filled mob yelling 'Crucify Him!'. How often we rejoice in Jesus Christ and then turn aside from Him to sin. We too are complicit in these double-standards, but we rejoice that in Christ's sacrifice we find the way to be reconciled with God the Father and each other, that our sins may be forgiven. We leave Mass today having heard of that loving sacrifice, knowing that God loves us so much that He sent His only Son. Reflect on that love, rejoice in that love, thank Him for it and look forward to the glory that His resurrection promises all who would believe and trust in Him.

HOLY WEEK & EASTER

All the liturgies of Holy Week and Easter will be on the webcam. All of them this year will have no human congregation and so will be celebrated differently to usual. All liturgy is a re-presentation, *not* a re-creation, of the saving events we celebrate. The fact that there can be no palm procession today, for example, in no way changes what we are celebrating and the gift of God's grace at work in us. Each day, reflect on what this great week means. Read the day's Mass readings of course and there are other suggestions about wheat to do at home in *italics* below.

- Palm Sunday 9am Mass -

We mark the beginning of Christ's Passion as He enters Jerusalem and so His death becomes inevitable. Mass begins with the Third form of the Entrance (as in any Missal), without procession and the blessing of Palms. All else is as usual. At home: please put some greenery over your door or in a window to mark today. Read St Matthew's Passion if you did not join in with a Mass.

Mon 9am Mass, Tue 6.30pm, Wed 9am - Maundy Thursday 7pm Mass & Watch -

Christ demonstrates His ministry of loving service by washing the disciples fee and celebrating the Last Supper. Tomorrow that service will culminate in the offering of His broken Body on the Cross. The foot washing (optional even in normal circumstances) is omitted, and there is no procession of the Blessed Sacrament. It is to be adored in the tabernacle tonight. The sanctuary is stripped and left bare as Jesus's arrest and suffering begin. At home, read John 13,1-15. Make an often used or seen space in your home as bare as possible, ready to fill again on Easter day. If you live with others, make a special care of cooking and serving one another. Have a crucifix ready for tomorrow.

- Good Friday 3pm -

Today we thank God for our salvation, made by Jesus, the Divine Carpenter, on the wood of the Cross. St John's passion is read. There is no procession of the Cross through church, but it is to be venerated. At home, use a crucifix of your own and venerate that after reading the passion. Keep it in a prominent place today.

- Easter Vigil Sat 8.30pm -

Christ is Risen! Create a paschal candle for your own at home. Rejoice! Light it each day as a sign of resurrection hope as we pray for an end to the pandemic, for its victims and for healthcare workers.

- Easter Day 9am -

Mass will include the renewal of baptismal vows. **Join in!** May the risen Christ bless us all! The eggs bought for servers and children will be kept for our first day back together, a day to look forward to indeed. It **will** come!

DO YOU, OR ANYONE YOU KNOW, NEED HELP?

We have volunteers, thanks to the SVP, ready to help anyone vulnerable or self isolating who needs shopping or prescriptions or anything else collected. We can make a friendly phone call too, but of course in order to stop the spread of coronavirus, we can't go into peoples' homes.
