COVID LATEST:

RESTRICTIONS FROM TOMORROW

The guidance from the Bishops has been made public. It is no surprise that it fully echoes the Government's call for caution and the scientific community's warning that the pandemic is not yet over. The Bishops write -

It is important to reiterate that... the general principles of continuing to create a safe environment in places of worship and their ancillary buildings are not abandoned.

It is therefore strongly recommended by the Bishops (listening to healthcare professionals and the Government) that **we continue to -**

- **Use face coverings**
- **Use hand sanitiser**
- **Ventilate the church building**
- **Use Track & Trace and stay distant**
- **Clean the church after weekend Masses**
- **Keep the existing unused pews to help with social distancing and cleaning** (Of course, if congregations get bigger, this will be reconsidered)

There is, therefore, very little that we should be changing in our routines to minimise Covid risk. Relaxing rules may be *legal* but not necessarily *safe* or *moral*. All of us would love to give up on Covid and the restrictions, but that is simply not sensible yet. All of us still have a duty to consider the health of others.

The Bishops furthermore recommend that changes to routines are made *slowly*— getting back to normal is a *process* and *not* a sudden event. So what will change first?

Gradually, according to the numbers of volunteers servers, music and tea and coffee will reappear. Congregational singing is not recommended yet.

From **Mon 19 July weekday public Masses** will resume. These will continue in the main church for the time being so that Masses may be shared with our online congregation and, with all that space, allow people to be as distanced as they wish. The weekday routine may vary a bit as we consider different possibilities.

On **Sunday 25 July, tea and coffee** will— *we hope*— be available after the 9.00am Mass.

Please remember that 'normality' will be difficult to reach until we have 'normal' numbers back at Masses. At present, something like only a third of pre-Covid attendance is happening. The summer holiday season is about to start. It would be unreasonable to expect all parish groups, events and societies to be as normal while so many people are absent. But if any group wants to re-establish itself, then please tell Fr Stephen and we can do our best to make that happen safely. Just because something isn't re-established soon

does **NOT** mean that it won't reappear later! First, there has to be both demand for something and volunteers to do it.

All of what we are doing will be under constant review: we simply don't know enough details about the future to map everything out precisely.

PLEASE COMPLETE THE PARISH QUESTIONNAIRE IF YOU ARE WILLING TO HELP

To help with establishing what is possible and when, a questionnaire has been circulated asking if people would soon like to resume the roles they had, or if they'd like to wait a bit. It also asks if anyone would like to take on something new. We start by circulating this in church because, obviously, those of you who come to Mass are prepared to be out and about, mixing with people. No one should feel any pressure whatever to make a commitment to doing something they'd rather not. Not every event or group is included on the questionnaire—for example, children's liturgy; this doesn't meet over the summer anyway, we don't have many children attending at present and so can be considered after the summer holidays.

THANK YOU TO ALL OUR VOLUNTEER STEWARDS AND CLEANERS. Cleaning and stewarding have to continue. Please *don't forget* that they have kept us open! Please volunteer to join the team if you can. We'd hoped this could stop, but it has been a truly great example of parish commitment. The welcome provided has been brilliant too!

THE PIETY STALL

It is very hard to see how this can be opened safely just yet, in accordance with the Bishops' guidelines. It has no ventilation and is very cramped. For the time being, please see Fr Stephen if you need anything from it but please don't expect the full shopping experience! Like everything else, this will be kept under review.

HOUSEBOUND COMMUNION

Communion may now be brought to the housebound routinely as before. Ventilation, sanitiser, face coverings and distance are still strongly recommended. *Please contact Fr Stephen* by phone, email, in writing or by friend or family member if you are ready to resume this. He is trying to make contact with all home communicants with this news, but *please don't hesitate to be in touch*. The lists may be out of date.

The Sunday Readings

JESUS is always moved by the needs of those who come to Him. Today, a vast crowd comes to see and hear Him. He has in fact gone off for what we might call today a retreat. But they will not leave Him alone. So, He teaches them. He doesn't send them away. He doesn't entertain them. They have come because of Him. We can easily forget that Jesus spent more time teaching than doing anything else. He teaches about God the Father, the Spirit, how to reach heaven, how to live as God wants, how to treat each other, how to pray...and so much else. Teaching in the Church today is so important. This is how the faith is handed on: not by 'lessons' as such, but by parents telling children, the quiet faithfulness of grandparents, the lives of the saints, the examples of ordinary Christians. We teach by our way of living, our attitudes and showing what's important to us. As Christians we are called to be like Christ, so we are called therefore to be teachers. We cannot hope to pass on the faith very effectively if we're not!

CONFESSION

It is available before 5pm Mass but always also by appointment if you'd prefer.

FUNERALS

Funerals may be celebrated, but please with the precautions above.
