# **COVID LATEST:** RESTRICTIONS NOW

The Bishops write -

It is important to reiterate that... the general principles of continuing to create a safe environment in places of worship and their ancillary buildings are not abandoned.

It is therefore strongly recommended by the Bishops (listening to healthcare professionals and the Government) that **we continue to** -

- Use face coverings
- Use hand sanitiser
- Ventilate the church building
- Use Track & Trace and stay distant
- Clean the church after weekend Masses
- Keep the existing unused pews to help with social distancing and cleaning (Of course, if congregations get bigger, this will be reconsidered)

Relaxing rules may be *legal* but not necessarily *safe* or *moral*. All of us would love to give up on Covid and the restrictions, but that is simply not sensible yet. All of us still have a duty to consider the health of others. The news about Covid seems to be encouraging but it eeds to stay that way for a few weeks yet before we may be certain. The Bishops furthermore recommend that changes to routines are made slowly– getting back to normal is a *process* and *not* a sudden event.

Thanks to those who have! Offers will be coordinated once August is over. There have been very many positive and helpful comments and suggestions. We start by circulating this in church because, obviously, those of you who come to Mass are prepared to be out and about, mixing with people.

No one should feel any pressure whatever to make a commitment to doing something they'd rather not. Not every event or group is included on the questionnaire—for example, children's liturgy; this doesn't meet over the summer anyway, we don't have many children attending at present and so can be considered after the summer holidays.

Once the summer holidays are over, and the Covid news is clearer we shall move forward bit by bit. We are happy to try to facilitate the return of parish groups as soon as members are ready.

### **BAPTISMS**

Baptism may be celebrated, please with precautions above. Please see one of the clergy after a weekend Mass.

#### WEDDINGS

Weddings may be celebrated with the conditions described above. Please make an appointment with Fr Stephen: six months notice is best.

#### CONFESSION

It is available before 5pm Mass but always also by appointment if you'd prefer.

#### **FUNERALS**

Funerals may be celebrated, but please with the precautions above.
